## North Dakota Simmental Association Board Minutes

#### Minutes from the April 11, 2007 meeting

The North Dakota Simmental Association board of directors met April 11, 2007 at the Seven Seas in Mandan, ND. Directors present: Kelly Hanson, Pat Thorson, Gary Sys, Doug Bichler, Claye Kaelberer and Greg Myers. Also present: Bob Grant, Sec/Treas.

Bob read the January 19, 2007 board meeting minutes. Motion Greg, second Claye to accept as read. Carried.

The board had a review and discussion of the North Dakota Simmental Scene content, costs (income-expense sheets were passed out), and acceptability by our members. Todd Finke joined the board by phone. Some of the items talked about: Content of the magazine; Cost to print and mail (cost to association was about \$700 for the first 3 issues); Mailing list (over 4,000 - mostly in the north central region) - larger the list the higher the cost to mail, means more income from advertising needed; advertising rate discussion; publishing of a directory every couple of years to keep current; and mail copies to ASA board members and the ASA office (few copies). Motion Pat Thorson to hire Todd for another year at same terms as the last year. If the Simmental Scene has a positive cash flow - 25% of the net profits will go to Todd as an incentive bonus. 2nd Claye Kaelberer. Carried. Motion Greg, second Pat to increase the color rate in the advertising by 10%. Carried. Position pages will be auctioned at the banquet (2007) for a two year period (2008-2009) in the Simmental Scene. A North Dakota Directory will be printed early 2009. Position pages for the directory may be auctioned at the 2008 banquet.

Doug Bichler will put together, print and mail a summer newsletter for the North Dakota Simmental Association Membership.

Bob gave the Treasurers report. Cash flow sheets were passed out. Bob and board went through and discussed the finances. Balances as of 4/8/07: Checkbook - \$11,181.40; CD's - \$8,464. Simmental Scene collections by Bob was discussed. Approximately \$3,500 uncollected to date.

Kelly gave a Junior Simmental report. The show season starts in June. The Junior Association has good numbers. The ASA has talked to Kelly about the possibility of North Dakota hosting a National Regional as early as 2008. This takes a lot of work by volunteers. The board will see what interest there is by the membership.

Annual Meeting - discussion on a speaker and possible topics. Pioneer, Promoter and Commercial Producer candidates will be needed for a late summer or early fall meeting. Doug will ask for names from the membership in these categories in the summer newsletter. The board will go through these suggestions and determine the receiver of the awards.

2007 Showcase/Classic report by the committee. Committee members are: Kelly Hanson, Dwight Keller, Doug Bichler, Bill Begger, Tim Clark and David Doll. Jeff Thomas has been hired to manage the sale. Nomination will be \$200 per ranch as last year. We will link our web site to EDJE web site. Discussion on extra sale consultants, paperwork, deadlines, Al'd females that are ultrasounded.

Field day has been put off for a year. Dates that seemed possible had conflicts.

State Fair picnic - Bob Gannaway and Gary Sys co-chairmen. Advertise the time and location better. Will put in the summer newsletter.

Bob presented where advertising has bee placed. Board requested that we look at more periodicals. Place 1/2 page in the ASA Directory. Ask The Cattle Business Weekly about possible directory and/or use that publication some this fall.

Sheets were handed out showing the committee assignments that were given last meeting.

- Fort Collins BIF conference - leave up to individuals to work together.


- ASA conference in Fargo. Board encouraged to attend.







## JBS Swift & Company and American Simmental Association Announce Marketing Grid Relationship

BOZEMAN, MT. Representatives from JBS Swift & Company and the American Simmental Association (ASA) are excited to announce the creation of a new beef carcass pricing grid simply named "70:70", that pays historic premiums for groups of cattle that combine high marbling levels with exceptional red meat yield.

"Carcasses that combine marbling and muscle have long been acknowledged as an industry ideal," said Jerry Lipsey, Ph.D., Executive Vice President of ASA. "The benefits to beef processors are obvious, with the increased percentage of closely trimmed, high value retail product produced by lean USDA Choice carcass compared to the saleable beef produced by fatter, less muscular cattle. Beef producers, too, will benefit from this arrangement because of the reduced production costs and increased marketing opportunities associated with large premiums for Choice Yield Grade 2s."

JBS Swift & Company, whose U.S.A. headquarters are in Greeley, Colorado, is currently the third largest US beef packer and is an acknowledged industry leader in the development of innovative procurement programs that encourage the production of better beef. Tim Schiefelbein, Value Based Procurement Manager for JBS Swift & Company is one of those credited with coining the term "70:70:0" and identifying it as an industry goal. Tim says, "The '70:70' grid is truly an excellent opportunity for producers to get paid for what they produce and what we, as processors, need to be profitable."


"The '70:70' grid is a good first step toward using actual beef cutout value for the pricing of harvested cattle," according to Marty Ropp, Director of Field Services for the ASA. Ropp went on to say, "The latest NCBA Beef Quality Audit reports industry averages of 57% USDA Choice or higher, 52 % USDA Yield Grades I and 2 with over 22% discounted or "Out" cattle. This is hardly an endorsement for current popular genetic programs and suggests the need for positive change. Only by combining the highest value Continental and British genetics can these system failings be corrected to produce cattle that approach a 70:70:0 target and add real value to US beef production."

Cattle that have been age and source verified through a USDA approved Processed Verified Program are an additional target of the "70:70" grid because of the significant premiums paid to the owners. The SimChoiceSV program offered by ASA and MicroBeef Systems is one such program for providing this age and sourcing verification.

## 70:70 Marbling and Muscle

All the fence building, hay baling, calf weaning and hundreds of other production tasks would be for nothing if the beef consumers of this nation disregarded our products. Beef Industry Leaders have focused on beef product demand and the results have been encouraging. Near record cattle and beef prices are partly the result of attentive action toward beef eating quality and consumer satisfaction, and we salute NCBA as the driving force enhancing beef demand.

Consumers choose beef because we like the taste. Even though the science and physiology of taste are complicated, every beef lover understands the attributes of tenderness, juiciness and flavor.

Both genetics and management play large roles affecting beef taste. Harvesting healthy, young, fast growing, well-marbled cattle that require either no implants or perhaps, mild growth stimulants are key to consistent and predictable great tasting beef.

From a genetic management and strategy standpoint, selection for both growth and marbling have become important. The cattle feeding industry certainly values fast-growing cattle with potential to grade Choice, and most breed associations boast rapid improvements in both Yearling Weight and Marbling EPDs. So, U.S. Beef producers are on our way to long-term success, right?

Not so fast! All of this discussion has been focused on output value. Is anyone willing to address production costs? Fuel, feed, fertilizer and labor costs are at combined all-time record high levels. Without doubt, we must produce beef that maintains and grows consumer demand, but every tool to control and combat costs is now important to the future of our industry.

Producing highly marbled beef is only part of the puzzle of beef industry prosperity. We absolutely must produce tasty, tender, juicy, high-value beef using proven technologies that can economically sustain our businesses. In this industry, the most effective and verified genetic technology available that can both increase output value and decrease cost of production is wise crossbreeding. The huge impact of heterosis on the calf crop and postweaning performance will almost always greatly decrease cost per unit of production. Moreover, prudent selection of genetics making up the crossbreds, will balance production values, such as maximizing percentage Choice, YG 2s. We have positioned Simmental to ideally blend with British genetics (called biological complementarity) and produce fast growing, USDA Choice, Yield Grade 2 fed cattle.

Industry and academic leaders have often suggested targets of 70% Choice or higher, 70% YG Is and 2s, and 0% outs (USDA Standard, YG 4s and 5s, light weights, heavy weights, etc.). Is their target achievable?


For more than a decade, the American Simmental Association has tested sires for ability to deliver both marbling and muscle, and our progress is becoming recognized across the industry. Simmental breeders have paid attention to identifying genetic lines that deliver both meat quality and carcass meat yield. In the recent decade, Simmental have improved both Marbling and Yield Grade EPDs; not many breeds can make that claim (you are welcome to review our genetic trends on www.simmental.org). Simmental x Angus and Simmental x Red Angus cattle can and do deliver a higher percentage of Choice, YG 2 carcasses than any other popular crossbreds or straightbreds. Considering that most herds retain heifer replacements, what combination of breeds can deliver more net value to America's cowherds than Simmental x British crossbred steers and replacement heifers?

Perhaps everyone in the cattle feeding industry understands the cost reduction of feeding Continental x British crossbreds, and beef packers profit from the meat yield advantages of muscular cattle. However, our industry has been waiting for price signals that encourage both high quality and outstanding cutability cattle.

To kick-start this process, the American Simmental Association and JBS Swift & Company have agreed to a marketing grid with historic rewards for Choice, YG 2 carcasses.

This marketing grid, called 70:70, provides outstanding rewards for fed cattle that can deliver both high marbling and muscular carcasses. This is a high payoff opportunity for well-documented genetics and management. Properly managed fed steers and heifers that result from carefully selected genetic sources will receive excellent premium price rewards from Swift. This represents a tremendous opportunity for feedyard managers who confidently know the source and history of cattle selling under the ASA-Swift grid marketing arrangement.

Understand, 70:70 isn't for "either/or cattle" (either fat, highly marbled; or lean, lowly marbled), where the seller "rolls the dice". This grid has true rewards for groups well above average for both quality and yield grade. There are hundreds of feedyards across the Midwest with pens of Continental x British cattle that can benefit when marketed on 70:70. The opportunity to simultaneously get premiums and reduce production costs may well be the most important next step for our beef industry to sustain and grow success. We don't think there are many silver bullets in cattle and beef production, but reducing production costs while receiving premiums for high quality, high meat-yield carcasses may be the best invention yet.




