



# RAISING RANCHERS MANDAN LAKE RANCH

"Wanna see my bull?" towheaded Laramie Staigle said as he swung a baseball bat. His younger brother Conley, too young to be a "big kid" but just old enough to know what end a cow stands up on first, chunked a foam ball in the general direction of his big brother.

The ball hit the top of the roof and rolled back down the side of the house.

"He's a big, nice bull. He's a good bull," Laramie continued. "Very, very big, you want to see him?"

Wade and Merri Staigle beamed at their oldest grandson.

"Actually, I think when we get done checking cows we should go inside and look at the sale catalog, then you can show off some of the other bulls," Wade said.

Laramie shook his head yes and ran in his grandparents' house.

"They really, really like looking at the bulls," Wade said with a chuckle.

#### Then and Now

In 1969, Wade Staigle's uncle purchased a herd of Simmental cattle when they were implemented out of Canada and Wade's father started AI-ing in the early 70's. The two brothers enjoyed running Simmentals, and in 1970, Wade's uncle sold the first Simmental-Hereford cross at the first Simmental North Dakota State Sale.

"I guess that's where we got our start," Wade said. "But then we kept breeding through AI and selecting powerful herd bulls and developed a high-maternal-end cow. The Hereford based cattle were very efficient cows, but had their problems as far as production, udder qualities, and eye cancer goes — but those half-blood cows were some of the best commercial cows you could make, but they needed to develop onto the next step."

To do this, the cattle were bred Simmental again to produce three-quarter blood cows. He said these cattle were the most powerful cows they had on the operation.

"From there, we just kept grading up until they become Purebred cows," Wade said. "Now, we're running about 400 black and red Simmental and SimAngus cows."

Backtracking a bit, Wade said in the 80's when the agriculture industry struggled financially, he sought another source of income and purchased an AI business from a local elderly man. He later sold his business in 1992 and took a sale manager job for American Breeder Service.

"At the time, we were still running a cowherd and had the opportunity to purchase a Pioneer cowherd from a long time AI customer," Wade continued. "We purchased the cattle and I came back full

time in 1997 and I'm so thankful I did because there's no better place to raise kids than right here."

1997 was a big year for the Staigle family, not only was Wade back on the ranch full time but this was also the year they held their first production sale.

Years later, in 2004, the Staigles merged their sale with three other breeders to create the widely known Dakota Xpress Bull Sale. Today, the Dakota Xpress sale hosts the Staigle's cattle and another producer, Hansen Simmental of Ryder, North Dakota.

"What compliments Simmental is that it makes the right feeder calf," Wade emphasized. "You pick up feed efficiency, fertility, and longevity to name a few. That's one thing we can toot our own horns about, our Simmental genetics have some built in longevity. You know, like many ranchers, I'm my own biggest critic: I want ever single cow out here to be the best one on the whole place, I want them all to be perfect. It's a priority that we have problem free cows."

Wade said two of his sons lease a place just north of the Mandan Lake headquarters and run about 450 commercial cattle on it.

"I want to just take care of the land and pass what I know and what I've raised on down to my family and then their families," Wade said.

#### It All Comes Back to Family

It's stated on the Dakota Xpress website that the goal of the Staigle and Hansen families is to "pass that legacy on to our children and the families to follow. The life of ranching in North Dakota takes many hours of planning and a constant attention to detail and organization. The ranch work is never quite complete as


there is always something that needs attention. But it is a lifestyle and work ethic that we truly feel we are blessed to be involved in on a daily basis and take great pride in providing a quality seedstock product."

Wade is proud of all three of his sons; he talks about them so respectfully and lovingly.

His youngest son, Logan, is an insurance agent for Farmers Union Insurance at Turtle Lake, North Dakota, and his two older sons, Daniel and Ethan, are partners on the ranch.

Daniel and his wife Amber have two sons, Laramie and Conley; Ethan is getting married in October; and Logan was married in August.

Wade's parents still live on the ranch and are active in farming and gardening, Wade said.



"Can we look at the bulls now?" Laramie asked.


Wade grabbed a 2020 sale catalog and sat down at the dinner table. The two boys climbed on his lap and flipped through the catalog, offering commentary page after page.



# CALF CROP GENOMICS FROM THE AMERICAN SIMMENTAL ASSOCIATION

Calf Crop Genomics, a research project launched by the American Simmental Association in collaboration with Neogen Genomics, offers a 50% off GGP-LD genomic test including parentage (\$25 compared to \$50 equivalent test) to participating breeders who test their entire calf crop. Genotyping entire calf crops is important to use genomically-enhanced EPDs (GE-EPDs) for selection decisions, reduce selection bias in genomic predictions, and increase the volume of genotyped animals for future improvements to genetic predictions. The latter two points make any singular genomic test in the future better for all members using genomics.

#### Benefits to participating members:

1.) Half-off testing and much more complete information to make selection decisions. Genomic testing is most valuable in cattle with low-accuracy EPDs and when used to make selection decisions. By testing the entire candidate pool of males, females, or both, breeders can make more informed selection decisions earlier in an animal's life, saving valuable resources spent developing bulls and heifers.

- 2.) Additional money back with complete weight trait and carcass records. Complete calf-crop phenotypic records also improve EPD predictions. The Calf Crop Genomics project offers a \$5 rebate if 90% of the birth group in a breeder's possession have birth, weaning, and yearling weights. Furthermore, if carcass records are submitted on the terminal calves, breeders can qualify for a \$15 rebate.
- 3.) Parentage included. The current error in parentage is estimated at 7%. Large scale testing will reveal and help correct pedigree errors, resulting in more accurate EPD predictions.
- 4.) Easier future parentage testing. For calves that are developed into seedstock, their parentage markers will already be on file making future parentage calls on their calves easier.
- 5.) Additional trait testing optional. Trait testing is considerably less expensive when coupled with genomic tests. These add-ons are available at the current GGP-LD prices.

#### What does "testing the entire calf crop" mean?

Members can choose to send all the male calves, all the female calves, or the entire calf crop born in the same season. Members must submit 90% of the calves born in a season (males, females, or both) to qualify for the research price point. For the purposes of this project, spring calves will be considered born from January 1 through June 30. Fall calves will be considered to be born from July 1−Dec. 31. ■

Similar to the National Cattlemen's Congress, The Nebraskan will highlight some of the breed's most elite in competition for Major PTP Ring of Champions show points.
